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## Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2020

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The principal function of this Parish is to support the advancement of the Christian religion by promoting, through the work of the Parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. Being open to, and engaging with, society as a whole and offering support for those needing help are fundamental to the practical delivery of the benefits of Christianity.

All functions of the Parish relate to the expression of the Christian religion through engagement with the general public, in particular the disadvantaged, the sick, the elderly and the young and is a public benefit.

The direct benefit of participation in Church life includes the enjoyment of regular worship, giving and receiving of pastoral ministry, improved understanding of the values relating to civic engagement, community cohesion and providing a bridge between diverse groups.

In addition to the principal function, the Parish has custody of property and of records, materials and artefacts of significance to the cultural and religious heritage, the maintenance of which is undertaken by the Select Vestry of this parish.

#### Management

All members of the Church of Ireland who are over the age of 18 and are either resident within the parish or live elsewhere but have been accustomed members of the congregation for at least three months, may register as members of the General Vestry of the parish, allowing them to stand for elected office and vote at annual meetings of the General Vestry. Meetings of the General Vestry are held at least once a year. The Select Vestry is elected as part of this General Vestry meeting. The Select Vestry members will hold their positions for a period of one year. Select Vestry members may be re-elected annually and there is no limit on the number of terms which may be served. The Select Vestry meets monthly with the exception of July and August and December.

The Select Vestry members are the Charity Trustees.

No trustee receives any remuneration, reward or private benefit for carrying out their trustee responsibility.

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Public benefit

Lisburn Cathedral seeks to engage with all of our local community through the ministries outlined below, however throughout 2020 with the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic and local and national restrictions on meetings, we have adapted our services and community engagement as outlined in the 2020 Covid-19 section of the report:

### Regular Activities

Sunday Worship: On Sunday mornings there are 2 services (9.30am traditional & 11.00am contemporary) with coffee served between services. In the evening we gather for fellowship at 6.30pm (not during the summertime).

Children and Youth work: Parents and Toddlers, Kidzone youth club (P4 to Yr 8) and Mettle, (Y8+) running weekly youth club, bi-weekly football, regular Friday drop in and additional irregular events, Scouts (all section from Squirrels to Explorers).

Prayer: Parish prayer time, prayer ministry, parish prayer chain, prayer appointments.

Prayer on the Street: A dedicated team of volunteers go out into our town centre once a month to offer a listening ear and prayer support to the people in our local community.

Lisburn Community Choir & Lisburn Community Children's Choir: We support both community choirs by giving them the use of our Cathedral building as their venue to meet each Monday evening.

Community Orchestra: We support the community orchestra by allowing the use of our Cathedral building as their venue to meet and practise.

Mission: South Lisburn Community Church - On Meetinghouse Lane in Hillhall, we have a house known as 'The Lighthouse'. We have a committed team who work within the community there offering fellowship, support, worship and teaching.

Pastoral care: Our clergy, along with our team of pastoral visitors, meet people in their homes, and particularly seek to stand alongside those with particular needs, the housebound and the bereaved.

Discipleship and Fellowship: Housegroups, Ladies Bible study, GEM (God Enriched Moments) Women's group, Mother's Union, Alpha, Nimble Fingers, Book Group, Men's Fellowship, Cameo club for our senior citizens.

Coffee Room/Honesty Cafe: We have a coffee room which enables anyone to come and sit in a beautiful, historic building in warm comfortable surroundings run by volunteers. It is open 3 days a week.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Debt counselling: Lisburn Cathedral has partnered with CAP and other local churches to offer debt counselling in our area. The service we offer is free.

Foodbank: The foodbank is an ongoing project to support people from the Lisburn area whose lives have been affected by the current economic recession which we actively support.

#### 2020 Covid-19

Throughout the periods of lockdown and during periods where some services have been permitted with limited attendance, we have sought to provide worship and fellowship through the use of streaming facilities to make our services available online.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

Our children's work has continued via online meetings and the regular supply of activity packs, posted directly to families, while our youth work has continued via Zoom, with small groups and irregular events being organised.

Our in-person prayer meetings have been curtailed, but through the use of various technologies, these have been moved to virtual meetings.

Pastoral care has continued throughout the pandemic, taking into account restrictions as required while continuing to seek to stand alongside those with particular needs, the housebound and the bereaved.

Discipleship and Fellowship: Housegroups, Ladies Bible study, GEM (God Enriched Moments) Women's group, Mother's Union, Alpha, Nimble Fingers, Book Group, Men's Fellowship, Cameo club for our senior citizens - All of these groups have sought to engage their particular members in various novel ways to keep contacts alive and ensure the enforced absence of regular social contact was offset through various activities.

The Cameo Club leaders have engaged extensively though monthly newsletters and small gifts to the homes of their members throughout the pandemic, while Nimble Fingers have supported shielding members of the group through regular Zoom based meetings. Housegroups have moved to online meetings and expanded their reach, helping keep families and individuals connected with their wider community.

The work of both CAP and the Foodbank have continued to be essential and support for both of these areas has continued throughout the year.

The Charity Trustees feel that the activities entered into during the year have achieved the Parish's objectives, as well as providing public benefit as referred to in the Charity Commission for Northern Ireland guidelines.

## Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2020

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Financial position

Financial reports are reviewed on an ongoing basis by the Select Vestry (Trustees) and are also reviewed on completion of the Annual Accounts. The Select Vestry presents the accounts at the annual meeting of the General Vestry prior to the elections.

Points to note during 2020 for our Parish:

- Due to the pandemic and ongoing restrictions most physical activities on the premises were curtailed or cancelled. As a result, the need for ongoing cleaning and administration was greatly reduced. In the spirit of the aims of the Furlough scheme, while considering the responsibilities of the parish as a charity, we made use of the government backed furlough scheme to allow us to retain specific staff while there was no work for them to do.
- With a reduction in activities, discretionary spending was greatly reduced, alongside reduced usage on power, water and oil, allowing us to conserve our ongoing income during the periods of lockdown.
- This has allowed us to continue our support for charitable work through organisations such as CAP throughout the year.
- Grants for expansion of work in the South Lisburn area had also been received, with an expectation of these
  being spent in 2020. This has been delayed and we expect that these funds will be spent as planned, once it is
  suitable and permitted to do so.
- During the year ended 31 December 2020. Total Expenditure (£263,546) and Gross Income (£313,188). Sources of Income and Expenditure incurred during the year are reflected in the Statement of Financial Activities.
- The Charity Trustees are reviewing the reserve policy of the Charity.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2020

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property

- 2% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 10% on cost

Equipment

- 15% on cost

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
