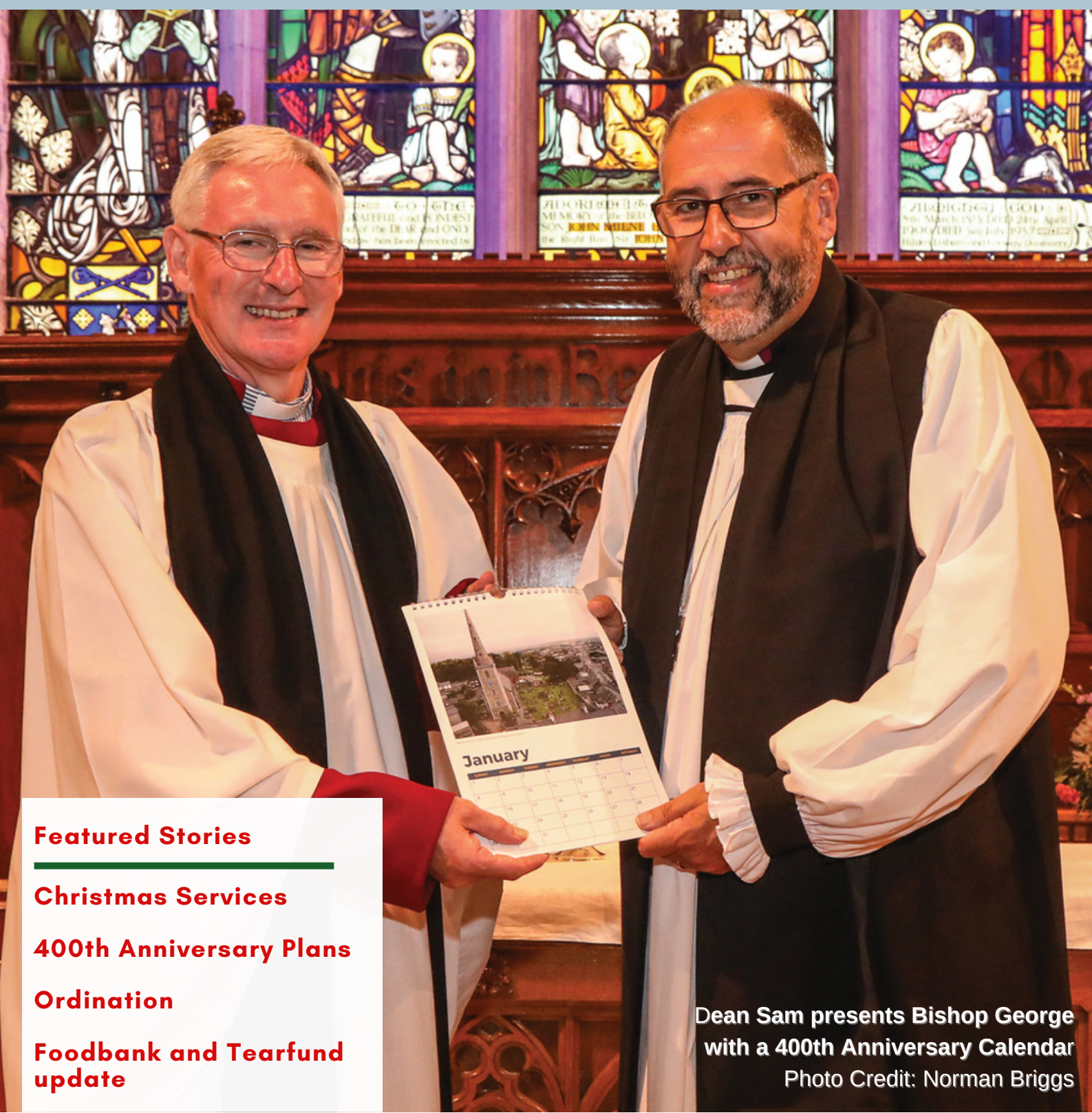

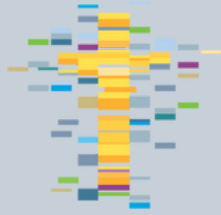

THE DEAN'S CHRISTMAS LETTER

“The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.”

Four hundred years of worshipping the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, of witnessing the Gospel, of providing teaching from the Scriptures, of being a place of prayer and of care for the people of Lisburn, is a landmark moment in the history of our Church.

There are two important events I'd like to invite you to come to early in the new year: **400 minutes of prayer on 7th January** and the **400th Anniversary Launch Service on 15th January 2023**. These opening events of prayer and worship are an expression of our historic role and our ongoing witness in Lisburn City, and as the Diocesan Cathedral for Connor Diocese.

We are delighted that the Mayor of Lisburn & Castlereagh City Council, Councillor Scott Carson and the Bishop of Connor, the Right Rev George Davison will be with us for the 400th Anniversary Launch Service.

We invite all parishioners to these opening events and to the many events in 2023 which will mark this significant anniversary throughout the year. We will also be inviting former members of the church to attend, to give us the opportunity to renew old friendships and to look to the future knowing that the redeeming love of Christ will continue to be with his Church and people in Lisburn Cathedral.

An exhibition marking the 400th Anniversary in the Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum launches on 25th January.

St. Paul exhorts us:

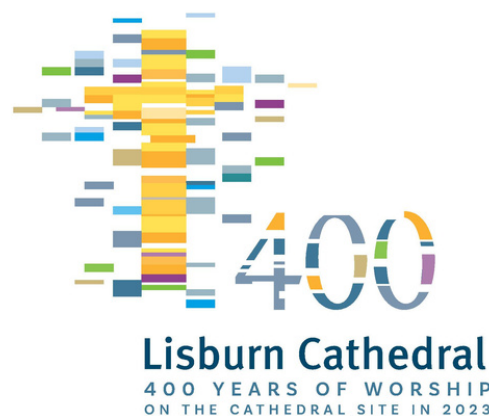
400 MINUTES OF PRAYER

ENGAGEMENT WITH WIDER SOCIETY

In recent months our rich history and its contribution to Lisburn has provided opportunities to engage with community organisations and civic society.

Firstly, a group from the Atlas Centre on Bachelors Walk were undertaking a project which included an investigation into the Suffrage movement and its impact. They visited the Cathedral back in the summer to hear how the exploits of the Lisburn Suffragettes created mayhem including planting a bomb at the Cathedral in July 1914 (if you want to hear more watch out for one of our talks in 2023).

The completion of their project was marked by the production of a banner, roughly 6 feet square which was unveiled in the Museum by the Mayor in October, an event that I was invited to attend. We hope to borrow that banner for some of our 2023 events.

CATHEDRAL ARCHIVE/ HISTORY ROOM

Probably few readers may even be aware of hundreds of photographs, books, magazines, leaflets and paintings that are in a room on the top floor of the Cathedral office building - known as the History Room.

The photo shows but one section of that room.

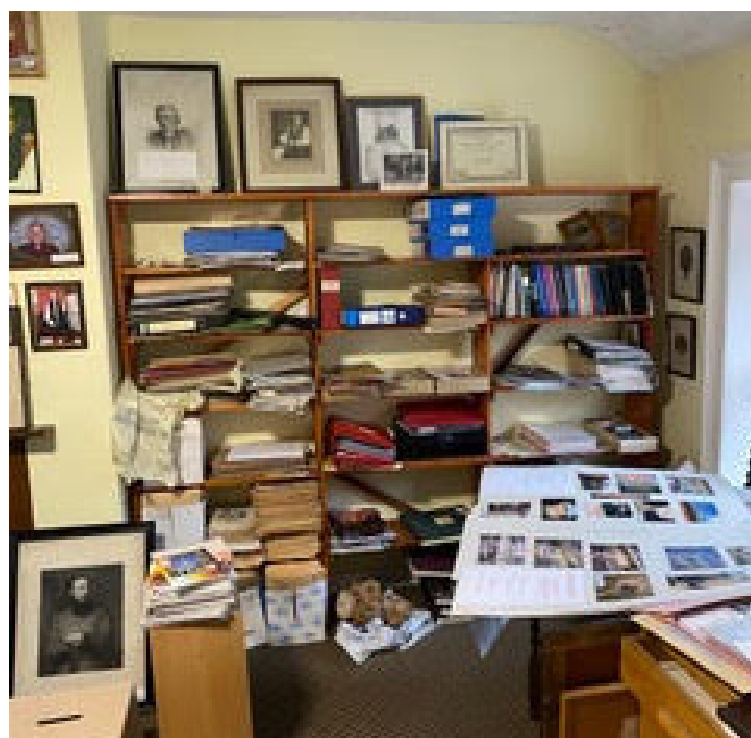
In October the Mayor unveiled 3 important portraits of members of the Rawdon family that the Museum had acquired (these are on display in the Museum). Sir George Rawdon is buried under the floor in the Cathedral and amongst his achievements was laying out the street plan of Lisburn, much of which survives to this day.

In the Autumn the Cathedral hosted visits by 2 groups - Lisburn Cross Community Group and a senior citizens group from Portadown spent a morning exploring our history and our current Christian service and ministry.

Gordon Galloway was invited to make a presentation to the Lisburn Historical Society.

Finally, another group from the Atlas Centre who are doing a photographic project on old Lisburn spent a morning with us in early November. They plan a publication of their work and will give us a copy.

All of these opportunities allow us to interact with wider society as part of our witness here.



CATHEDRAL ARCHIVE/ HISTORY ROOM CONT'D

Museum staff and other historians believe this collection of artifacts is of significance as it helps illustrate the development of Lisburn and demonstrate the extent to which the church, originally known as St Thomas's, now Lisburn Cathedral, made such a significant contribution to the city.

Parallel with planning for the 400th anniversary in 2023, we have been exploring how that collection might be preserved and made available to a wider audience.

ORDINATION

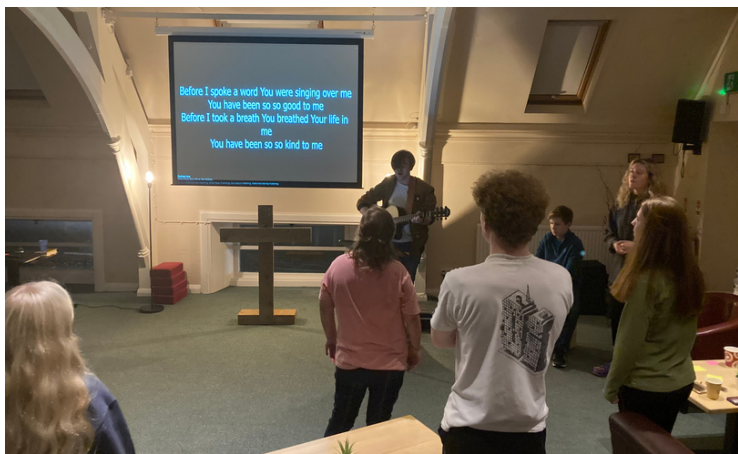

LISBURN Christians Against Poverty (CAP)

"I honestly don't know what to say! Feeling a bit emotional to be honest! Yes, that would be another stress alleviated! Thank you for all you are doing to help us! Its appreciated beyond what we can show." So said a new client recently as we started on the journey out of debt with her and her partner.

It has been some 8 years since we were launched in Lisburn Cathedral and we thank GOD that we have filled our quota of 2 new clients per month over those years. CAP HQ in Bradford provides the specialist advice for our clients and for this we pay them £500 per month.

We are now supported by 15 local churches and individuals and have a team of 2 debt coaches and 8 befrienders and a publicity team member. Whilst the debt coaches explain and deliver the process of debt relief, the befrienders give support and encouragement to their clients until they are debt free.

The intention is to bring them along to a local church where they can learn about God and become followers of Christ. It can take between 5 months and 5 years for a client to go debt free and so befrienders and clients can build a very special relationship.

CAP not only deals with Debt via its 20 centres in Northern Ireland but also the causes of debt via CAP Money courses, Job Clubs and Life Skills Groups.



We are also blessed in Lisburn by working closely with the Lisburn Food Bank, and again this year our clients will benefit from a Christmas Hamper, thanks in part to your generosity.

You may not hear much about what we are doing as it is confidential but be assured we do all we can to fulfil our vision **'TO MEET OUR CLIENTS NEED AS BEST WE CAN'**.

Please be on the look out for those who may be in need of our service. You will find CAP leaflets available in the Cathedral or if you wish to find out more about what we do, please speak to me or a member of the CAP team.

New to Lisburn ?

Welcome to Lisburn Cathedral. It gives us great joy to welcome new people to worship. It is our desire to provide a caring worshipping community where through teaching and prayer we grow and mature as Christians who know Christ and learn to follow him as our personal Lord and Saviour.

Registration

Then following prayerful consideration, if you decide the Lord is calling you to commit to worshipping regularly in the Cathedral, the registration forms will enable you become members of the church. These forms can also be filled out should you have moved house. We can only store information with the consent of those who are registered members and this information enables us to serve the needs of our members more effectively. Registration forms are available for download on our website, and printed copies are available in the porch of the Cathedral. If you need any assistance accessing these please contact our Administrator by phone or email.

Weddings

Christian Marriage is the most important decision any couple can make together. All couples are asked to attend Church each week, attend the Marriage Preparation Course and uphold Christian standards as they prepare for their Marriage.

All dates should be checked with the Dean before booking with hotels as the staff and Cathedral may not be available for specific dates. A Wedding Information sheet will be provided to couples, which should be returned to the clergy, before a firm booking is taken.

Baptism

What a joy it is to welcome the children of believing Christians into the fellowship of Lisburn Cathedral through baptism. The Clergy should be contacted to provide the parents with the 'Baptism at Lisburn Cathedral' leaflet. You can download this leaflet from our website: **lisburncathedral.org/family-celebrations**

Once parents have read this information they may decide to bring their baby for baptism or thanksgiving service. Both parents should be regular attenders at Lisburn Cathedral and have the clear intention of bringing up their child in the fellowship of the Christian Church.

The purpose of our Children's Ministry in the Cathedral is for all children to have the opportunity to come to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour.

Funerals

Please notify clergy or staff immediately upon serious illness or death of parishioners for support and guidance. The Clergy should always be consulted before any funeral plans or times are arranged.

Hospital & Nursing Home admissions

Not every hospital has a chaplain and therefore we are no longer automatically informed about admissions, so we would value your help in keeping us up to date with parishioners who are unwell.

After 2 years of restrictions, we would be delighted to visit those in hospitals and nursing homes.
