DEAN'S CHRISTMAS LETTER

"The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God." Luke 1:35

Our house is full of a sense of anticipation as we await the birth of our twin grand children. The journey to get here has had its high moments and then difficult ones for our daughter in law, Louise. On this journey towards the births we are thankful for all the advice, care and experience of our health professionals (I had never heard there was a parents twins clinic to prepare them for the arrival of two children at once!) Nevertheless there is a great sense of excitement as their birth draws ever nearer and as all the family come together to see them over Christmas.

This has brought home to me the challenges a young mother two thousand years ago would have encountered walking and riding to Bethlehem. To then arrive only to discover there were no beds to rest and then for the young mother to give birth in a bare stable where the animals were feeding. Yet Mary had received the promise from God, that her child was conceived through the Holy Spirit and that her little child was to be called the Son of God. Mary's journey towards the birth of her son, 'the holy one from God' had more than its share of ups and downs. Yet she stored these things in her heart and she knew the Holy Spirit would be with her and with her son, through the many ups and downs of their lives.

The celebration of Christmas is rightly focused on the birth of Jesus, yet if we go a little deeper it all began with the Holy Spirit. In Matthew 1:20 we read that an Angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph to tell him:

"do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. She is to become a mother by the Holy Spirit."

It is the Holy Spirit who has brought this seemingly impossible thing, this completely unexpected miracle, to pass. Just as the Holy Spirit was working at the very beginning of Jesus' life journey so he would continue to be with him to the end, in all the ups and downs, on his final journey to the cross and on his resurrection from the dead.

As we celebrate this Christmas let's look a little deeper to see the Holy Spirit who was with Mary and Jesus on their life journeys, and let's seek that same power of the Holy Spirit to guide us on the ups and downs of our life journeys.

May this Christmas and New Year be a time for God the Holy Spirit to refresh your faith in Christ as Lord and Saviour and a time of rejoicing as you renew your love for Christ and for his Holy Spirit to come to you and to cover your life now and always.

400 YEAR ANNIVERSARY REFLECTION

LISBURN CATHEDRAL 400 YEAR EXHIBITION LAUNCH

It was fabulous to have an official launch of the 400th Anniversary Exhibition in the Irish Linen Centre & Lisburn Museum on 26th October. The Cathedral Chapter members and a good representation of Cathedral members attended the official launch event, the Communities & Wellbeing Chairman at Castlereagh Lisburn & City Council Committee - Councillor Thomas Beckett, in comments his opening stated how remarkable it is that we are marking four centuries of history at the Cathedral site. He outlined the history of the founding of St Thomas' Church in 1623 and the subsequent conferring of Cathedral status in 1662 by King Charles 11. "The history of the Cathedral," he said, "is intimately linked to the history of our town and its people, and we are delighted that our Museum and Heritage Service has partnered with Lisburn Cathedral to deliver the exhibition."

In my comments that followed I highlighted the past and present engagement of the Cathedral with our community in Lisburn. In recent years the Cathedral has been the place where we have met for interdenominational worship on occasion of historic importance such as the the Platinum Jubilee of the late Queen Elizabeth 11 and the Coronation of King Charles 111.



We have also continued to offer events in the Cathedral buildings and out in the community for everyone in Lisburn, such as the Big Church Serve at Easter and the Nativity in the Square in December and our Night of Lights which was happening the day after the exhibition officially opened and had been fully booked out. Our partnerships with the Council, the City Centre Management and most recently with Museum Staff are an important aspect of the role of the Cathedral as we seek to serve and witness in Lisburn.

The exhibition has been made possible by the Museum staff and Cathedral members, working in close partnership to diligently record and display significant moments in history from the past 400 years, and I am grateful to all those who have contributed. It is also thrilling to see a special model of the Cathedral surrounding and buildings, created by our Nimble Fingers Group for its 400th anniversary, is on display as part of the exhibition. The exhibition will be open until March 2024 and I encourage everyone to take some time to visit and to discover more about our rich heritage in the Cathedral and in Lisburn.

I am thankful to all who have contributed so much to our 400th anniversary in the Cathedral, the New Irish Arts concert was a feast of outstanding music, the Gala dinner, the family BBQ, the afternoon tea and the Friends of Lisburn Cathedral service were wonderful ways to celebrate, the six history talks have provided a wealth of information and these have followed on from a community concert, the launch service and 400 Minutes of Prayer. There is more to come as we celebrate Christmas and our 400 years, two concerts on 15th & 16th December

with Lisburn Community Orchestra, Lisburn Community Choir, Harmony Hill Primary School Choir and special guests. The celebrations will continue over Christmas and we will have a final family celebration of 400 years and looking forward to year 401 on 31st December at our joint 10.30am service. In all of these concerts and services we have an opportunity to honour Christ and his faithfulness to us and to build one another up in the Lord as we close this year and look to the future with faith and hope in Christ.

As we move towards the end of 2023 and the 400th anniversary of worship on the Cathedral site, readers might have thought they had heard the last from me on the subject of that anniversary – not so – there are still a few things I want to say.

christians against poverty

Last issue I wrote about Martin Lewis (Money Saving Expert) saying that Christians Against Poverty (CAP) were unsurpassed when it came to helping those in debt. Now I am going to discuss the number of adults who need help with their debt and whether or not they are asking for help.

A recent YouGov poll for CAP showed that in Northern Ireland:-

- Over 1/3 (35%) adults surveyed (an estimated 509,000 people) have been finding keeping up with bills and credit commitments a heavy burden
- 12% now have debts that they do not know how they will repay.
- A third of adults (33% or about 480,000 people) in Northern Ireland feel they have become financially insecure.
- 1/4 (25%) adults (367,000 people) say that they would not be able to pay an unexpected expense of £200.

So if the population of the Lisburn area was 120,000, approx 12,000 need help. Disturbing but not surprising figures as I remembered an article published a couple of years after our Debt Centre was opened in Lisburn in 2014 which indicated that about 10% of the adult population were in unmanageable debt but were doing little or nothing about it. Unfortunately nothing much has changed, indeed it probably has got worse. I also believe the causes for debt are also similar. Causes such as, illness, death of a partner, relationship breakup, property crash, interest rate rise, inflation, redundancy, business failure or unexpected bill i.e. home or car repair.

Whilst there are a number of 'not for profit' debt agencies available, I think many people bury their head in the sand and pretend all is well. You and I pass them everyday of the week, not realising what a miserable life they are leading which would be resolved if they only asked for help. A friend of mine who is also a CAP Debt Centre Manager gives a talk where he asks his audience to turn to each other and say 'You look just like a CAP client' because it gets across the message that debt is no respecter of persons.

Why then are people reluctant to ask for **help?** Pride is probable the greatest obstacle asking for help because we feel in embarrassed, ashamed, afraid of what people might think, believe that is will affect our credit rating and a reluctance to burden other people with a problem of our own making. Well as Martin Lewis says your problems will only go away when you ask for help and there are many agencies available such as Step Change, Advice NI, or the new Debt hub at the Lisburn Food Bank. (We work closely with the Food Bank as many of our clients have benefitted from food parcels over the years and hopefully will continue to do so.)

So my plea today is that if you are in unmanageable debt or know of someone who is, or have influence in the community where you live, ask for help or spread the word that there is help available. In the case of CAP, it is free and confidential. We will visit the client at their home or if that does not suit any other suitable place. I remember helping a young man who lived at home but did not want his parents to know and we helped him keep his privacy by meeting away from his home. I really don't mind which of the 'not for profit' charities people use but we in Lisburn CAP would love to help but you need to phone CAP at **0800 328 0006** to make an appointment. The phone will be answered by people in CAP Bradford who friendly, HQ in are understanding and sympathetic.

We have helped numerous people who have waited years before they eventually summoned the courage and asked. They regretted the delay as having made the call they found they could sleep at night knowing their difficulties would be resolved by help from professionals who had a proven track record, cared for them, and would stick with them until they were debt free. Join the many people in N.I who have gone debt free and don't remain a miserable statistic. As our Lord said "I have come that they may have life, and life in abundance"
