

# **DEAN'S EASTER LETTER**

Our 400th Anniversary year has started at a strong pace -

The Bishop of Connor, the Rt Rev George Davison during the 400th Anniversary Launch Service shared his family connections with Lisburn and recalled with gratitude his month long placement in 1991 in the Cathedral with Canon John McCammon.

Bishop George encouraged us to stop for a moment to reflect on our history and to inspire the next generations to worship God. He said we are also to go out from the Cathedral to share the eternal truth, hope and salvation of the Messiah, the Son of the living God.

Congratulations to the nimble fingers group, who produced a wonderful knitted model of the Cathedral and surrounding buildings that was greatly admired.



Other important events include two days of prayer and an Anniversary Concert.

In early February we bade a fond farewell to Rev Danielle McCullagh who had served as our Curate & Vicar for five and a half years. The Service of Introduction as Chaplain to the Hub and the Church of the Resurrection at Queen's on 15th February marked the beginning of a new era for Danielle in her service for the Lord Jesus.



The five Mental Well-being workshops facilitated by John Campbell are now underway with a good uptake on the places.

The planning is well underway for the Big Church Serve 2023 "All through History", you will see further details on the next page. Please do sign up to volunteer in this exciting engagement with the community, as we share the good news of Jesus.

On the weekend of the Coronation of King Charles 111, we will be having a celebration service and lunch to mark this historic moment. A Civic Celebration Service is also in the planning stage.

9-11th June - Celebration Weekend and a Friends of Lisburn Cathedral Service.

These are events where our greatest desire is to share the life changing and historic truth of a Saviour who died for all mankind to come to him to receive hope, peace and new life through faith in Jesus Christ. Three days after Jesus was crucified he rose from the dead, the risen Lord Jesus then met with his disciples and taught them the wonderful and life changing truth from history, the law and the prophets about everything that had happened:

"This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." Luke 24:46 – 49.

These words from Jesus inspired his disciples to go out and proclaim that, Christ is risen from the dead!

In everything that we do let us make it our greatest desire and our joy to tell others the story of Easter and to invite them to receive the hope of the living Lord Jesus for themselves.


#### 16 September

# PLANNED HALL WORK

As we look to Easter and new beginnings, it is an opportune time to update you on the new plans for our church hall. The existing building was completed in 1885 following construction that started for the Sunday School in 1884. It has been used in many ways over the years, including a period of wartime service during WWII when the Sunday School was held in the Cathedral. There has been one major refit circa 1989 when the stage was removed and the McCammon Room and upstairs area were created.

Today the hall supports regular use by the Kidzone Sunday, Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and Explorers, Community Orchestra, Weekly Work Team, Mums & Tots, Ladies Bible Study, Cameo, Kidzone Friday and Mettle, not to mention funerals, weddings, social events, Christmas Events and a number of other community activities.

With the constant usage, wear and tear is inevitable and while running repairs are a regular occurrence, several key structural parts of the hall have now reached a point where a major overhaul is needed:

- Windows and frames need replaced and updated to be more energy efficient.
- Brick work needs detailed attention to clear developing plant growth and ensure the weather integrity of the building is maintained.
- The energy efficiency of the building needs updated.
- Roof needs an overhaul to ensure it is fit for the next 50 years.
- Main hall floor needs attention.
- Interior and exterior wood work needs repaired or replaced in a number of locations.

The hall, while not listed, is in a conservation



area and adjacent to the Cathedral and Castle Gardens, both of which are of historical significance and as such all work must be sympathetic to the immediate environment.

The 2022-23 Select Vestry have reviewed the work needed and some options around alternatives and have instigated work to start planning to update the building in the Summer of 2024.

To do this our working budget is between £500,000 and £600,000. Options for more radical changes than those outlined above, were estimated to be in excess of three times this amount.

To keep our hall functioning in a state that reflects our ongoing support for all the users of the hall today we need your support. If you have spare time, and any knowledge in building, architecture, grant application or fundraising, we need your help. If you can afford to help financially, we need your help. We will be looking at grant possibilities, but we still need to raise most of the finance ourselves as there is no spare capacity in our normal operating funds to support this type of capital project.

# 25 YEARS ON, GOD IS STILL CHANGING LIVES

(Colossians 3:17)

It's hard to believe that this year Abaana is celebrating its 25th birthday.

And it all stemmed from God placing a burden for children in Africa on the heart of a 19 year old, called Scott Baxter, the founder and CEO of Abaana. From those early days, God has faithfully continued to bless, encourage and provide resulting in £8m being spent on projects in Africa.

The first Abaana sponsor child was Catherine Nanfuka, who later travelled as an adult chaperone with the 2017 New Life Choir and made an emotional appearance at the Cathedral. Now today, through the amazing kindness and generosity of supporters, some 1900 children are currently receiving an education through sponsorship.

Work started in January this year on new school buildings for St. Mary's Primary at Kagoli in Eastern Uganda. This will be the 17th Abaana primary school. It is estimated that currently over 7,000 children are being educated in Abaana-built schools.

We thank God for the staff in Uganda who are currently working with 55 former street children, providing them with a safe, secure and loving environment in New Life Homes (NLH). The goal is to see them safely and happily resettled with their immediate or extended families. 26 of our former NLH boys have completed their education (secondary or third level or vocational) and are now living independently. What a change from living rough on the streets!







#### You are making a difference.

Quite literally, none of this would have been possible without the amazing support and continued kindness of people like you, the Cathedral Church family. Here are some of the ways the Cathedral has been making a difference through Abaana since 2014:

- o 40 children sponsored by the cathedral family and connections;
- o 2 volunteer teams to Uganda;
- o Hosted 2 New Life Choirs 2017 & 2019;
- o Regular donations, fundraising, sponsorship directly by the Cathedral

(Since January 2014, in total this has amounted to £26,508.60! – How amazing is that?)

#### **Changing lives**

While it can be easy to focus on the numbers of children sponsored, the education cover provided, the number of new primary schools built, the work that <u>together</u> we are involved in, is about so much more.

It is about individual lives being changed. Children being given a new start and hope for a better future. Making a lasting difference in their lives now, today and for eternity.

Thank you so much for your faithfulness and for partnering with Abaana to make that difference, one child at a time.

In terms of visiting speakers we have had Heather Flanigan speak on human trafficking in Northern Ireland, a very interesting and sobering subject.


Also, Michael Fryers from the N I War Memorial Museum gave a very interesting talk and slide presentation on the Belfast Blitz.

# LOOKING AFTER GOD'S

WORLD



The Earth is the Lord's and everything in it – Psalm 24. When we consider this verse, how might we act to protect, preserve and promote the well-being of both our planet and ourselves? We are all making lifestyle changes with these aims in mind and we would love to share these experiences within the Cathedral family.

Spring has sprung...the days grow longer and warmer. Critters are once again flitting and fluttering about. The natural world feels renewed with so much beautiful green and verdant colour. As nature is coming back to life, spring is just calling out for some exploration.

Did you know this is also God's start of the year, the first month of Aviv, mentioned in Exodus 12:1 and 13:4?

Perhaps you might consider starting a nature diary, noting the first bumble bee, the first bats at dusk, the first swallow or other first bird sightings. Who in the family can spot the most?

Do you remember the first lock-down when everyone noticed bird song again?

Spring is a crucial food time for garden birds and their chicks. Bird seed is no longer enough. They want the richest food available, carotenoid-rich caterpillars. So consider anything that encourages insects and particularly caterpillars. Perhaps limiting pesticide use or providing fresh clean water. It's not just birds that will use it, but bees will also call in for a drink. Healthy insect life makes healthy bird life.

# **GEM**

In GEM this year we have been focusing on the book True Friendship by Vaughan Roberts. I previously read this book about 8 years ago. It amazes me how you can read a book for a second or third time and get something totally different from it. I think this depends on what season of life we are currently in and our relationship with God.

I am a coffee person and love to get out for a coffee. I now class myself to be middle aged and as well as a few very close friends, I have a lot of people who I have met over the years and that I still like to stay in contact with or meet for coffee. This was beginning to become a problem a few years ago as I started to become riddled with guilt if I had not met up with these people or been in contact. At the time God pointed out to me that this was something I needed to address and quality is better than quantity (it is still a work in progress). Then the world shut down and we couldn't even meet with our family never mind our friends or acquaintances. Thank goodness I had plenty of coffee at home.

In chapter 2 of "True Friendship" Vaughan talks about how there is a difference between friending and friendship. In friending, more is always better, but in friendship it is quality not quantity that matters. (The same could be said about coffee.)

On our Facebook/Instagram profiles or in our address books, (does anybody apart from me actually still have an address book?) we might have loads of friends and everybody shares how they are living the best life ever, but, in a time of real need how many could you trust to



share your, grief, illness, concerns or joy with? We need a few true friends and we need to be true friends. Friends who are dependable, who will listen, who will be truthful and who will just be there when needed.

When I was a young lady of 15 (a few years ago) I remember sitting in my parents living room on my own one Monday evening and crying out to God for a good friend. A few months later God answered that prayer. 38 years later, with lots of ups and downs in both of our lives, she still remains that true friend I prayed for. Since then I have gained a few other true friends along the way.

If you don't feel you have a true friend I urge you from the bottom my heart to pray and ask God for one.

And in times of trouble it is powerless to cheer. It has no ears to listen, no heart to understand. It can not bring you comfort or reach out a helping hand So when you ask God for a gift, be thankful if he sends Not diamonds pearls or riches, but the love of a real true friend.
