


RECTOR'S LETTER

The past year has been full of unexpected events. Little did we know a year ago that we would spend most of the next 12 months in lockdown. The disruption to our lives has been unexpected and a shock to the system. The disruption in church worship has also had a profound effect our lives. It is therefore with great joy, and much caution, that we reopen for worship at 11.00am on Easter Sunday, 4th April 2021 with a service of Holy Communion.

Booking online, face masks, hand sanitising, social distancing and extreme care will be required as we return. The services will continue to be live streamed for those who aren't ready to return yet. We also hope to be able to safely increase our in-church capacity in the weeks to come.

It has been a long and tiring winter for so many of us. It is in times like these that it is more important than ever to stand on the firm ground, made available to through the Cross and Resurrection. As Christians we celebrate Easter because of these two most unexpected events history. It is clearly seen in the life of Mary Magdalene as she approached the tomb of Christ, John 20. She had in mind what she expected she unexpectedly discovered God's far better plan.

She expected: a tomb closed and sealed.

Unexpectedly she discovered: a tomb open with the stone rolled away.

She expected: a body wrapped in grave clothes.

Unexpectedly she discovered: no body and strips of linen lying there.

She expected: to be alone, to weep and cry for Jesus by herself.

Unexpectedly she met: two angels and a gardener.

She expected: the cold and dead body of Jesus.

Unexpectedly she met: the Risen Jesus, "He is alive" she cried out and she rushed forward to hug the living Lord.

Mary didn't get what she expected, she discovered the unexpected. Her life was changed, fear turned to joy, her tears to laughter.

Even in these times when so much of our day to day lives is not what we were expecting, we need to ask ourselves if we are ready for the unexpected hope and life that God has for us?

For what God planned for us is better by far.

His son unexpectedly born of a human mother.

His son unexpectedly walked in the world as we do.

His son unexpectedly died on a Cross.

His son unexpectedly rose from the dead and is alive forevermore.

His son sent the Holy Spirit to be with us always.

Are you caught up right now in grieving the things you expected this last year? Or are you open to the unexpected and greater things from God today?

Wayne Corideo challenges us to be God's expectant followers

"If God has a great plan for our lives, isn't it time we believed the same? Isn't it time we believed what God believes? That's called faith, and our attitude is a direct barometer of our faith. When the great architect Frank Lloyd Wright was 83 years old, he was asked which of his works would be remembered as his greatest masterpiece. He replied, "My next one!" The future is brighter when your attitude is right. You'll have more energy, your creativity level will increase, and you'll stay younger!"

As this unexpectedly different Easter approaches, be expectant that God will be with you and that he has a great plan for your life. This is a resource for all ages, so each day there is also a family activity to do together.





The second week of the month is our "Mettle On the Move", technically know as the "banter" week! We've really missed just being able to hang out with our young people so this allows time to have some craic together and get to know each other more! "Mettle On the Move" nights have included - Murder Mystery, Escape Rooms, Challenge Nights and Games Nights!

The third week of the month is "Mettle Motivation", our youth service for the month. We have had some great speakers from Crown Jesus, Exodus and Connor Diocese! During Lockdown we've been on Zoom and had worship leaders from City Church and Journey Church leading worship for us!





In mid-March we also started our Mettle Exodus Team! We meet every Monday night to complete the exchange course through Exodus. This consists of studying the book of Matthew together, praying together, exploring how we do mission and simply having some banter! We are now moving into Easter and we are so excited to be involved in the "Love Lisburn" project with 6-8 other youth groups over Holy Week! We will also be having a "Big Mettle Bake-off" on Thursday 1st April where our lockdown culinary skills will be put to the test!!



But around this time last year, our church announced they were doing internships and immediately I felt God affirm this was the right next step for me. I'd been involved with exodus teams for the past 8 years and worked with young people so I knew that youth was the area I felt called to within the internship. I've been doing this internship with Mettle, our youth group, alongside teaching part time in Largymore Primary School and tutoring primary school pupils. 

ALPHA




