DEAN'S LETTER

Dean Sam Wright

"Seeds of Hope" - Big Church Serve: 27th - 31st March 2024

The season of lent has been described as the time when we think back to those New Year's resolutions we have failed to keep and set ourselves more realistic goals in the weeks leading up to Easter. This is also the time when signs of new life can be seen in the world around us, as buds appear and the bulbs and seeds that we planted last year appear and burst into life. The season of new life has come, spring and Easter are about new life, and both began with seeds planted in dark places that then offer new life after the darkest of times. In John 12:23-25 Jesus told his disciples:

"The time has come for the Son of Man to receive glory. What I'm about to tell you is true. Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only one seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. Anyone who loves their life will lose it. But anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it and have eternal life."

The seed must die in the darkness before it germinates and comes to life again. In this simple story Jesus tells us his story, that his life will fall like a seed that falls to the ground and dies. In his song "Love crucified arose" Michael Card wonderfully describes how in the darkness of his death new life for mankind is germinated by Jesus.

At last the time to love and die
The dark appointed day
That one forsaken moment when
Your Father turned His face away

Love crucified arose
The One who lived and died for me
Was Satan's nail-pierced casualty
Now He's breathing once again

The seed of hope for everyone has been planted by the Fathers' only Son giving his life as a sin free sacrifice. It is this amazing grace filled love of Jesus that we will be sharing with others by sowing "Seeds of Hope" in all the activities we have planned for Hillhall & Lisburn City Centre.

Please read through them and we would love it if you would sign up to be one of those sowing seeds of hope during our Big Church Serve 2024. We as the church that believes Jesus changes everything are to share this hope through Christ with passion and a deep commitment to bringing new life to others.

Bishop Tom Wright says that "a mission-shaped church, must have its mission shaped by hope; that the genuine Christian hope, rooted in Jesus' resurrection is the hope of God's renewal of all things, for his overcoming of corruption, decay, and death, for his filling of the whole cosmos, with his love and grace, his power and glory."

How amazing that is! Jesus doesn't just improve our lives a little, he germinates new life that bursts vibrantly into the world. In Christ "Love crucified arose" and his offer of new life is the true hope for our world.

Have a happy Easter, one that is filled with the new life of Christ.

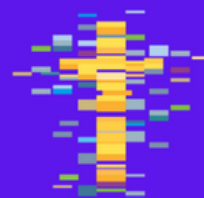

This choir of 20 children hail from the beautiful country of Uganda, often referred to as the 'Pearl of Africa.'

They were selected through auditions from schools built by Abaana across Uganda. They serve as ambassadors for their friends and families back home, sharing their stories through song and dance.

This tour is called 'Who I Am' because we firmly believe that all of God's children, regardless of the colour of their skin, educational background, age, or position in society, hold equal value and are equally loved by God. Poverty not only deprives children of an education and a future, but can also strip individuals of their identity and selfworth.

We want everyone the choir encounters to know that you are loved and have worth!

Witnessing the choir's personal journey is inspiring. We are even more excited about the positive impact these children will bring back to Uganda. Through this experience, they aim to secure sponsorship for themselves and potentially 300-500 other children. This support will significantly change their lives, marking the start of their 'Who I Am' journey.

If you are in this age group and would like to get involved please do get in touch with Lee and Beth, you would be so welcome and we would love to have you along with us to either home group or our next get together.

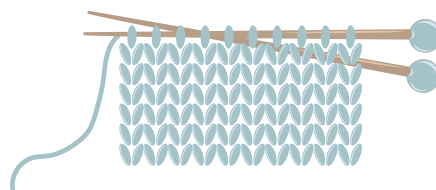
NIMBLE FINGERS

LIZARDS AND US AS CHRISTIANS

This year, when I went to the Isle of Wight, we went to various Natural Trust reserves and landmarks. As it so happens, we were at its only windmill, in Bembridge. While my brother and sister indulged themselves in a production line of mud pies, I went with my Mum to a little corner area. There, we inspected the long grasses and bushes, observing the local fauna and flora most would usually cast a blind eye to. As it happened, my eyes fell to a particular spot on a tree, occupied by two common lizards. This interested me, as I had never seen lizards this close, and I was surprised they let me come within a metre.

I, myself have an RSPB membership to try and help cool creatures, but what if all of us as Christians were to chip in to help these animals? Christianity teaches that we should show kindness to every living being, so let us show kindness to the animals and do our part, even if it is just hanging up a bird feeder or helping a little beetle from being squashed.



Psalm 50:10-11 says "for every animal of the forest is mine and the cattle on a thousand hills. I know every bird in the mountains, and the insects in the fields are mine." With human intervention, we may be able to help numerous species that would be in danger from our everyday activities.

Ten years in Lisburn CAP

Below is a selection of responses from clients, taken from our monthly team meeting minutes.

30/10/2014 FIRST TEAM MEETING. Of the present 12 team members 7 were at this meeting!

ROCKY START In the early days to help publicise who we were we organised a BBQ in a local church AND the BBQ went missing and has never turned up - We invited a CAP speaker along to a church hall AND there was a bomb scare - We were about to give a presentation to the Lisburn and Castlereagh Council AND the computer with all our slides broke down!

2014 After leafletting a local estate one person picked up the leaflet and knew in her heart it was for her. She gave her life to the Lord during a visit of 2 team members and her debts, caused by the sudden death of her spouse have been paid off.

2016 On returning for a second visit to a lady who had cried during most of the first visit having handed us 18 inches of debt letters, I hardly recognised her. She was transformed having had the stress removed by CAP dealing with her debts and creditors.

January 2018 After 7 months 'R', a single mum, was able to manage on her own. This was after she had taken an overdose when her children had been removed, the fear of losing her home and mounting debts. She would have died had the police not found her unconscious. That Christmas her children were with her and her finances were under control.



January 2019 'X's mother rang a team member to say that her son had taken his own life. The team member was shocked and spoke to the mother who thanked him for trying to help her son. Very very sad.

February 2019 'Thank you very much for your support throughout the process. I got my head down and worked hard with the plan CAP prepared for me. I have learnt valuable lessons that I can take with me going forward. Thanks again.'

Sept 2019 - Sept 2020 We were unable to take new clients for about a year when CAP closed to reorganise and Covid struck.

February 2020 'A' collapsed (Doctor thought stress) and could have died. After working with CAP she said 'Thank you for all your prayers and all your help'. She has moved with our help to the North Coast to be nearer her family and is a joy to be with.

June 2020 Having paid off £24K in a year 'C' said, "Thank you...please keep doing what you do...you are a blessing and a big help....I really appreciate it...as you say Freedom and New life!

March 2021 'Three Hips and Hoorays. I am debt free, thank you so much.'

December 2021 After a client received financial help provided by supporting individuals and churches she said 'I didn't know such people existed'

CAP CONT'D

February 2022 After 10 months 'M' went debt free. Two team members had been in tears when she initially explained why she needed help.

March 2023 After the TV programme on 'loan sharks' who identified potential victims from people visiting food banks 'C' came to our house on a Friday evening and cried as she told us how she was being abused as she could not pay off her debts. The loan shark was not from the Lisburn area, but she is now debt free and has regained her life.

May 2023 After 5 years and repaying more than £50k 'C' and his family are debt free. He also overcame an addiction which caused his debt problem.

June 2023 A team member phoned several creditors and resolved 'J' debts accumulated after her husband died suddenly.

A recent YouGov polling report commissioned by CAP indicates 1/3 of adults (509,000 surveyed) have difficulty making payments - 12% don't know how to repay their debts - 1/4 say they would not be able to meet an unexpected expense.

New to Lisburn ?

Welcome to Lisburn Cathedral. It gives us great joy to welcome new people to worship. It is our desire to provide a caring worshipping community where through teaching and prayer we grow and mature as Christians who know Christ and learn to follow him as our personal Lord and Saviour.

Registration

Then following prayerful consideration, if you decide the Lord is calling you to commit to worshipping regularly in the Cathedral, the registration forms will enable you become members of the church. These forms can also be filled out should you have moved house. We can only store information with the consent of those who are registered members and this information enables us to serve the needs of our members more effectively. Registration forms are available for download on our website, and printed copies are available in the porch of the Cathedral. If you need any assistance accessing these please contact our Administrator by phone or email.

Weddings

Christian Marriage is the most important decision any couple can make together. All couples are asked to attend Church each week, attend the Marriage Preparation Course and uphold Christian standards as they prepare for their Marriage.

All dates should be checked with the Dean before booking with hotels as the staff and Cathedral may not be available for specific dates. A Wedding Information sheet will be provided to couples, which should be returned to the clergy, before a firm booking is taken.

Baptism

What a joy it is to welcome the children of believing Christians into the fellowship of Lisburn Cathedral through baptism. The Clergy should be contacted to provide the parents with the 'Baptism at Lisburn Cathedral' leaflet. You can download this leaflet from our website: lisburncathedral.org/family-celebrations

Once parents have read this information they may decide to bring their baby for baptism or thanksgiving service. Both parents should be regular attenders at Lisburn Cathedral and have the clear intention of bringing up their child in the fellowship of the Christian Church.

The purpose of our Children's Ministry in the Cathedral is for all children to have the opportunity to come to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour.

Funerals

Please notify clergy or staff immediately upon serious illness or death of parishioners for support and guidance. The Clergy should always be consulted before any funeral plans or times are arranged.

Hospital & Nursing Home admissions

We are no longer automatically informed about admissions by hospital chaplains, so we would value your help in keeping us up to date with parishioners who are unwell or in hospital.

When Clergy are informed of church members in hospitals and nursing homes they would be pleased to visit them.
